This milestone signals the readiness of ATARC's Working Group team to commence demonstrations for the AI and Mobility tracks within the Lab.

The Phase 2 Lab series focused on integration across the Zero Trust framework and are available for government members to view by request. ATARC invites leading industry vendors, integrators, and teams to participate in these demos, fostering a collaborative environment where stakeholders can evaluate and refine solutions that meet the highest standards of security and performance.
